- Who are we meeting with? Assembly & Senate targets include regional representatives and the Committee Chairs of Disability, Health, Mental Health, Ways and Means/Finance, Majority Leaders, Presidents and Speakers.

Our Budget Ask:

We are requesting that SBANYS be included in the NYS budget for \$125,000 in 2024 to support
our annual growth in requests for services. NYS funding would aid our efforts to host programs and
improve service delivery for consumers across the state and lifespan. As the sole affiliate chapter in
our state, without any restrictive eligibility requirements, NYS funding is vital to advance services
and supports for those impacted by Spina Bifida in NYS.

Community Information Session – Exploring Weight Management

Weight management is complex but critical to understand. Abnormal weight status has a profound impact on overall health and is associated with secondary health conditions. When co-occurring with Spina Bifida, carrying excess weight further limits one's independence and ability to self-manage health. This presentation will provide a broad overview of weight management and the role of weight-related behaviors such as nutrition and physical activity. 
